The school curriculum

Our core subjects are:

- ▶ Maths
- ▶ English- reading, writing, spelling
- ▶ Science

Our foundation subjects are:

Literacy - Year 3 expectations:

We will learn to

Reading

- Comment on the way characters relate to one another.
- Know which words are essential in a sentence to retain meaning.
- Draw references such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions.
- Recognise how commas are used to give more meaning.
- Recognise inverted commas
- Recognise: 1. Plurals 2. Pronouns and how used 3. Collective nouns 4. Adverbs
- Explain the difference that the precise choice of adjectives and verbs make.

Literacy - Year 3 expectations

We will learn to:

Writing

- ▶ Use conjunctions (when, so, before, after, while, because).
- ▶ Use adverbs (e.g. then, next, soon).
- ▶ Use prepositions (e.g. before, after, during, in, because of).
- ▶ Experiment with adjectives to create impact.
- ▶ Correctly use verbs in 1st, 2nd and 3rd person.
- ▶ Use perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time and cause.
- ▶ Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech.
- ▶ Group ideas into basic paragraphs.
- ▶ Write under heading and sub-headings.
- ▶ Write with increasingly legibility, consistency and fluency.

Maths - Year 3 expectations

We will learn to:

- Read, write and order numbers to 1000 in numerals and words.
- Add and subtract numbers mentally including 3 digit plus 2 digit e.g $123+50$ as well as 3 digit plus 3 digit e.g. $126+200$.
- Know 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables and their corresponding division facts.
- Measure, compare, add and subtract lengths - m, cm, mm.
Mass- kg, g.
- Estimate and read time with increasing accuracy to the nearest minute.
- Solve one and two step problems using information presented in charts.
- Recognise and use fractions as numbers.

Literacy - Year 4 expectations

We will learn to:

In Year 4, your child will continue to practise the skills they learnt in Year 3. They will:

- ▶ talk about similar pieces of writing, and using these to help them plan their own
- ▶ plan their writing by talking about it or writing down key words
- ▶ use a rich vocabulary and a range of sentence structures to make their writing interesting
- ▶ create settings, characters, and plots for stories
- ▶ use simple organisational devices (for example, headings and sub-headings) when writing non-fiction
- ▶ proof-reading their writing for spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors
- ▶ read their writing out loud.

Maths - Year 4 expectations

We will learn to:

- ▶ In Year 4, your child will develop their mental and written calculation skills using larger positive numbers and fractions.
- ▶ Learn about negative and decimal numbers, as well as some Roman numerals.
- ▶ They will convert between units of measurement, find perimeters and areas, and learn more about angles and symmetry.
- ▶ Plot shapes on coordinate grids and start to use time line graphs.
- ▶ They'll count in steps of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000, add and subtract four-digit numbers and multiply three-digit by one-digit numbers. They will know all the times tables up to 12×12 and be able to divide by 10 and 100 to give decimal answers.
- ▶ Rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000, or whole number for decimals.

- ▶ As you are aware, we have the multiplication check in June 2025. This is to check your child's timetable knowledge of the 2-12 timetables. Please let us know if you need a laptop to practice at home.

PE Kits

- PE is on and **Tuesday and Thursdays** for Year 3. Children should come into school wearing their kit.
- Year 4 **Tuesday Swimming** and **Wednesday** PE.
- Correct kit consists of navy blue or black shorts and a navy blue top. In winter, children may wear tracksuit bottoms, comfortable trainers and their school jumper.
- For swimming, children can wear their swim wear underneath their school uniform (underwear must be packed along with a towel, goggles and other essentials).
- Consider a braid/ swimming cap for those with thick long hair or braids
- Please remove earrings for PE - we do not want them catching onto something or falling out and being trodden on!
- No big labels!

The small things that help...

- ▶ Early nights (please) so they're wide awake

How you can help at home

Reading

Spellings

- Practise the spellings given each week and discuss the meaning of the words. Children will be given the Year 3 and 4 spelling list with their homework. Please keep it to practise.

Extras

- Times tables tests/mental maths tests every week - they will take part in a times table check in June 2025- Year 4.
- Practise adding, subtracting and dividing rapidly
- Practise using TTRS at home



Other ways to help at home

- ▶ Writing shopping lists, letters, stories, etc. Sometimes focus on handwriting
- ▶ Encouraging children to EDIT their writing (it's ok to make mistakes)
- ▶ Calculating totals and change in shops, estimating and measuring in different units
- ▶ Practical experiences of using money
- ▶ Reading time, directions, timetables
